Geocaching Etiquette

- ◆ Obey all local laws. Follow regulations governing the use of roads and other public areas.
- ◆ Don't harm the environment while searching. **NO Digging!**
- ◆ Respect the geocache. Replace the container exactly as you found it.
- ◆ Don't expose the cache to non-cachers (be stealthy)
- ◆ If you take something from the cache, leave something of equal or greater value.

GET STARTED TREASURE HUNTING

1. All you need is a GPSr or GPS Enabled smart phone, pencil & trinket. You can download a free GPS app on your smartphone or tablet such as “Pure GPS”
2. To get coordinates and other information for the *Cache in on Brentwood History* geocaches,
 - A. Register for a FREE basic membership at www.geocaching.com. This site also contains tutorials to help get you started Geocaching.
 - **NOTE:** The **Geocaching.com mobile app** does not allow you to view multicaches that are a large portion of the *Cache in on Brentwood History* Tour without a paid subscription. They can be viewed at Geocaching.com on any computer for free but not with the App.
 - Log in and search for the caches in this series by the geocaching codes (GCXXXXX) found on the passport
 - B. If you are not interested in joining Geocaching.com you can also get the geocache descriptions and beginning coordinates on the Brentwood City website <https://www.brentwoodtn.gov/about-us/history/history-scavenger-hunt>
3. Choose any geocache from the list to get started. They may be done in any order.
4. Enter the Coordinates in the geocache description into your GPSr device. Follow each cache’s instruction to find and open the caches. You will be ask to solve the combination lock code to open the geocache. Sometimes the information you need will be on a Historic Sign and at other times it will be in the Geocache Description write-up.
5. Master Locks: Once the code for the combination lock is dialed in, push the lock shank into the base and the lock should pop open. To close the lock, the code still needs to be dialed in. Push the shank into the base and then mix the numbers to relock.
6. Once the cache is found and opened, sign and date the log book inside, and record the Secret Code found inside the lid of the cache container to your passport.
7. Trade trinkets of equal or greater value. DO NOT leave candy or food.
8. Once you are finished with the cache, replace the log, lock the cache, and put the cache back exactly where it was hidden.
9. Log your finds at www.geocaching.com if playing thru geocaching.com
10. Now on to the next site and do it all over again.
