
Welcome to the City of Brentwood's Adopt-A-Mile program!

I imagine you already realize the importance of having an Adopt-A-Mile program with our city. Your desire to contribute to help with the cleanliness and to maintain the high standards of beautification for our city is what brought you here.

The environment, planet earth and our City are important to us, and that is where you and your group come in.

Why should we take part in the program?

- 1. Demonstrates community pride
- 2. Makes a positive statement for a clean and attractive city and community
- Helps to keep our roadways and waterways free of litter and debris
- 4. Reduces stormwater runoff and prevents water pollution while promoting watershed awareness (we are part of the Harpeth Watershed)



DID YOU KNOW?



Program Rules

- Minimum of Quarterly Pick up You may pick one of these groups:
 - o January, May, September
 - February, June, October
 - March, July, November
 - April, August, December
- 2 year minimum commitment is required. You may of course renew your contract as many times as you like upon completion of each commitment. Due to costs of having a sign made and installed, this is non-negotiable.
- 1clean up must be completed in accordance to the City's adopt-a-mile agreement before a sign will be ordered and placed at your designated road or section of road bearing your groups name.
- Participants will be at least 10 years of age. Participants between 10 and 17 years of age will be adequately supervised by an adult. There should be at least one (1) adult supervisor for every four (4) youths, age 10-12 yrs. and one (1) adult supervisor for every eight (8) 13-17 yrs.
- All supplies are to be picked up at the Service Center to ensure proper gear is being used during your clean up.

You will receive the following supplies per TDOT rules and regulations:

- Trash bags
- Cones (optional)
- Class II vests for # of people in your group (mandatory wear)
- Disposable gloves (one set for each person listed in your group)
- Litter Pick Up collapsible signs
- o Pickers
- A crew plan & supply request sheet is to be filled out online and submitted no less than 3 business days prior to your cleanup date for it to count towards your annual commitment.
- Supply return is to be done within 2 business days of your cleanup date.
- A collection/activity report must be submitted upon completion of your scheduled clean up for it to count towards your agreed upon obligation.
- A list of adoptable streets will be provided. You may pick an available street, or you will be assigned one according to the City's greatest need. You are welcome to clean any streets NOT on the approved list, but it will not count towards your obligation of an approved street.
- There is a mandatory TDOT approved safety video to be viewed prior to your first approved clean update. This video is on our website.
- A program packet will be distributed upon receipt of your application.
- If you have new volunteers participating in subsequent pickup events, the City of Brentwood requires that they read the safety guide, watch the TDOT safety video and submit all release forms prior to any pickups.
- If there is any change in status with information about your organization, the groups coordinator is required to give the updated information the city's coordinator, Jamie Booker, to ensure all information is current, true and correct.



SAFETY REMINDERS

We value your safety first and foremost, so please take the time to read over and apply the reminders that we have outlined below. Precautions are to be followed at ALL times while you are on the streets.

- Hold a safety meeting before each pickup.
- Carpool to help minimize the number of vehicles at the site or meet up at a close by location that is safely out of the way of traffic.
- Put your safety vest on prior to getting on the road
- Wear closed toe shoes, light colored clothing and gloves.
- Place the Litter Pickup signs at the beginning and end of your route.
- Face oncoming traffic while working.
- Work in pairs. Keep your working group to no more than 6 10 people.
- Avoid picking up during peak travel times.
- Stop working if inclement weather approaches.
- Avoid overexertion.
- Do not remove hazardous substances or materials.
- Watch for snakes and sharp objects.
- Stay clear of construction areas.
- Do not go to the median to pick up items. Stay off the pavement.
- Participants 10-17 years of age must be adequately supervised by one or more adults. Ratio: At least one (1) adult supervisor for every four (4) youths.
- Stay hydrated. Drink plenty of water.
- Wear sunscreen.
- Do not overstuff or compact the bags. When a bag feels heavy (usually around 10 lbs.), secure it and start another bag. Place all bags together on the roadside and notate it on your collection/activity report.
- No horse play or waiving of arms that might distract drivers.
- Stay alert.
- Do not wear headphones, ear pods, ear buds or any other device that would limit your auditory sense during cleanup.

BAG IT, MOVE IT, OR LEAVE IT?



BAG IT- THESE ITEMS ARE SAFE TO PLACE IN THE BAG:

- Small items made of paper, cardboard, plastic, Styrofoam, wood, rubber, glass or metal- provided that the item does not have sharp edges.
- Small empty containers- provided they don't have sharp edges.

MOVE IT- THESE ITEMS SHOULD BE PLACED ALONGSIDE YOUR STACKED BAGS AT THE EDGE OF THE SHOULDER:

- Items with dull, pointed edges that might tear the bag.
- Large items that would prevent a bag from being properly tied closed.
- Heavy items that could tear a bag, provided the item can be moved without causing physical injury.
- Containers that are not empty if the contents won't spill when moved and you can identify the product as one that is not hazardous. If you suspect that an item contains urine, do not move it.

LEAVE IT- IF IN DOUBT, LEAVE IT ALONE!

- Items should be left where found without taking further action if they are: sharp, large, or heavy items that could cause physical injury if moved.
- Any item in an unsafe location (within six (6) feet of a traffic lane, or unstable ground, etc.)
- Any item that you cannot identify, and suspect may be hazardous.
- Unclosed or leaking items containing hazardous substances. Items may have labels such as Explosive, Toxic, Harmful, Corrosive, or Poisonous Gas written on them.

PLEASE USE YOUR BEST JUDGEMENT AND BE CAREFUL!



METH LAB AWARENESS INFORMATION

The roadside dumping of illegal meth lab waste is becoming a serious problem in Tennessee, even in Brentwood. It may look like carelessly dumped trash but is extremely hazardous to your health and has a serious impact on our environment.

Don't let meth waste threaten you or your group's safety! If you see any of the following items along the roadside, do not approach or attempt to remove these items. Instead contact the Brentwood Police department at (615) 371-0160 and report your findings.

THESE ITEMS COULD BE PORTABLE METH LABS THAT HAVE BEEN HIDDEN OR STORED BY THE ROADSIDE. MANY PORTABLE METH LABS HAVE BEEN KNOWN TO BE BOOBY TRAPPED.

- Empty or used alcohol products such as isopropyl rubbing alcohol, denatured alcohol, etc.
- Numerous empty pill bottles and packaging, especially empty blister packs of nasal decongestant or cold remedies.
- Containers of separated liquids of ANY color.
- Bottles that look they contain urine or windshield wiper fluid.
- Unused matches without striker plates, or washed striker plates.
- Corroded propane tanks or tanks with blue discoloration. Watch out! This means the tank is explosive!
- Boxes of battery fluid or bottles of muriatic acid.
- Kitty litter bags, especially if they look like they've been opened or taped closed.
- Trash bags that are taped shut or with tubes coming out of them.
- Containers with any type of tubing attached.
- Anything put together or bundled up with duct tape.
- Suspicious looking toolboxes, coolers, or other convenient storage containers.











Bag It, Move It or Leave It?

BAG II- These items may be placed in a bag:

- Small items made of paper, cardboard, plastic, Styrofoam, wood, rubber, glass or metalprovided that the item does not have sharp edges.
- Small, empty containers provided they don't have sharp edges.
- MOVE II- These items should be placed alongside your stacked bags at the edge of the shoulder:
- Items with dull, pointed edges that might tear a bag.
- Large items that would prevent a bag from being properly tied closed.
- Heavy items that could tear a bag, provided that the item can be moved without causing physical injury.
- Containers that are not empty if the contents won't spill when moved and you can identify the products as one that is not hazardous. If you suspect that an item contains urine, do not move it.


LEAVE II- If in doubt, leave it alone!

- Items should be left where found without taking further action if they are: sharp, large or heavy items that would cause physical injury if moved.
- Any item in an unsafe location (within six feet of a traffic lane, or unstable ground, etc.)
- Any item that you cannot identify and suspect may be hazardous.
- Unclosed or leaking items containing hazardous substances. Items may have labels such as Explosive, Toxic, Harmful, Corrosive or Poisonous Gas written on them.

ROADSIDE SAFETY REMINDERS

- All participants are to watch the TDOT highway safety video available via our website at www.brentwoodtn.gov
- Each group leader must sign a waiver of liability for the organization and list each participant by name.
- Minimum age of participant must be 10 years of age.
- Adult supervision is required for the following ages:
- One adult to every four 10-12-year-old; One adult to every eight 13-17-year-old
- Safety vests must be worn by every participant on the road
- Pick up is to be done during daylight hours only
- Be observant and use caution when crossing the road.
- Work in a minimum of 2 per group

SHOULD

- Wear light colored clothing, hat, long sleeves and protective shoes (preferably closed toe) and gloves
- Face traffic when picking up
- Wear sunscreen (when applicable)
- Stay hydrated
- Be alert for snakes, stinging insects, ticks and poison ivy
- Carpool to your pickup location and park safely off site of your route on a side street or parking lot
- Have a first aid kit readily available
- At least one participant should be CPR qualified in case there is an emergency

DON'TS

- Do not work on bridges, overpasses, under overpasses or tunnels
- Do not work in bad weather
- Participants must not engage in horseplay or other activity (such as waving of arms) that could distract a driver and put themselves or other participants safety in jeopardy
- Do not wear earbuds or headphones while picking up. Keep all electronic devices in your pocket.
- Stay clear of construction areas.
- Do not overstuff bags or compact them. When a bag feels heavy (about 10 lbs.), tie if and leave it on the roadside for pick from Public Works. If possible, place all bags together.

Do NOT Touch!

If you find any thing that looks suspicious... be safe, don't touch, make the call.

- Broken Glass
- Dead Animals "Road Kill"
- Heavy or large objects such as tires, furniture or car parts
- Plastic bottles, wrappers, cigarettes or dip pouches, cola or beer cans

Adopt-a-Mile Agreement

INFORMATION ONLY

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into on _____

between the City of Brentwood, hereinafter called the "City" and ______

_____ hereinafter called the "Group".

WHEREAS, _____ (road name) , _____ (segment), is a part of the

City roadway system in the City of Brentwood, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Department of City of Brentwood, has established the

"Adopt-A-Mile Program" encouraging local organizations, private business and volunteer

groups to help keep Brentwood beautiful through litter removal.

WHEREAS, the Group wishes to commit to maintaining (Adopt) a segment of

roadway to remove litter on: ______ (road name) , _____ (segment).

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

١.

A. THE GROUP SHALL:

- a. Commit to removing litter at least three (3) times a year in the right-of-way of the roadway and section of adopted road by the Group.
- b. Perform litter removal in accordance to the guidelines of the City's Adopt-A-Mile program.
- c. Conduct safety meetings prior to litter removal.

- All participants are required to watch the TDOT highway safety video available on the City's web page (link will be provided).
- e. Group leader must sign a waiver of liability for the organization and each participant is required to sign this waiver and have it turned in to the program coordinator upon picking up equipment for the litter event.
- f. Remove litter during daylight hours only.
- g. Remove litter during good weather conditions only.
- h. Request all necessary equipment through the appropriate channels a minimum
 - of 3 days prior to a scheduled event.
 - i. Safety Vests
 - 1. Adult
 - 2. Child
 - ii. Trash Bags
 - iii. Disposable Gloves
 - iv. Pickers
- i. Litter is NOT to be picked up at areas of construction, in tunnels, on bridges or overpasses.
- j. Safety vests are always to be worn by all participants during the litter removal event.
- k. Participants must be a minimum of 10 years of age. Adult supervision is mandatory for all participants under the age of 18.
 - i. One adult to every four 10-12-year-old

- ii. One adult to every eight 13-17-year old
- I. An after-litter event report must be submitted within 3 days of pick up for it to count towards your annual commitment.

B. THE CITY SHALL:

- a. Provide safety vests, trash bags, disposable gloves and pickers for use by the Group.
- b. Remove filled trash bags from the adopted roadway section and dispose of them at an approved facility, unless otherwise noted by the Group leader.
- c. Install the Groups name under an approved Adopt-A-Mile sign on the adopted roadway section after the completion of your first litter event.

Π.

No member, officer, director or volunteer of the Group shall be an employee or independent contractor of the City for any reason whatsoever in carrying out its commitment under this agreement.

|||.

The Group agrees to release, hold harmless and discharge the City of Brentwood, County of Williamson, State of Tennessee, its officers, agents and employees from any/all liability for injury to my person, damage to my property, or death, whether-or not such liability is based on allegations of negligence while participating in City of Brentwood's Adopt-A-Mile program on or near any road within the city limits of Brentwood. I acknowledge the fact that working on or along roads can be a hazardous activity, and that I accept the risks associated with this work. The Agreement shall remain in effect for a two-year period. The City may terminate this Agreement if the City feels the Group is not fulfilling its commitment in a reasonable fashion with five (5) days written notice.

V.

This Agreement is non-transferrable and non-assignable in whole or in part.

VI.

This Agreement is for litter removal activities only. Any hazardous event is to be reported to either the Brentwood Police Department or the program coordinator. Graffiti is to be reported to the program coordinator.

VII.

The City shall provide a list of roads and sections on that road to be adopted.

I CERTIFY that I am familiar with the information contained in this Agreement and

that I possess the authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the Group.
