# Deerwood Arboretum Timeline

## 1970

• City of Brentwood purchases farm land

#### 1980

- Brentwood outgrows plant capacity.
- EPA orders Brentwood to find another sewage treatment solution.

1987

Sewage pits were filled in

#### 1991

- Two grants totaling \$12,700 are secured.
  - Original kiosks, trail markers,
    - brochure & logo are made.
  - 189 trees planted
  - Pond made
  - Deerwood Tree Committee

## 1975

 City builds first and only wastewater treatment plant

#### 1985

 Land sits largely abandoned and unused

#### Early 1990's

- Brentwood Rotary approaches City w/possibility of turning land into passive park land.
- Funds for Engineering and design were donated.
- Park offices move into original building on site.
- Commission approves \$50,000 for phase I development.

1997

- More trees planted
- Eagle Scout makes brochure of trails and features
- City opens the Service Center and Parks offices move out of Deerwood.
- Rotary goal to raise \$25,000
- largely unsuccessful.
- Phase II tree planting and 1.5 mile walking trail complete.

#### 1996

 Commissioner Bob Hicks wants to make land useable and funds are approved for park improvements

### 1999-2000



- Foot bridges are installed to connect the northwest subdivisions
- Land is deeded to connect bridges

#### 2002



- Funds allocated for tree tags
- Brochure made in accordance to State standards

- Rotary finds lack of awareness is major obstacle for funds and improvement.
- Erin Kiney starts with the City Parks Dept.
- Property largely unkept
- Building vandalized repeatedly

#### 1999

- Paved trail and 4-board horse fence installed connection Belle **Rive Drive**
- Tree screen planted

#### 2001

- Old Sewer building demolished
- Current facility built



• State certification received

## 2008-2014

 Leaks in ponds and poly lilies caused aerators to fail and be removed

# 2016

- Master Gardeners take on Deerwood as one of their projects- helping to mulch and inspect trees
- **Brentwood** initiates **Environmental Day**

2002-2022

• Tree Board makes biannual inspections of trees

- Park staff assigned to property to care for trees and site
- With aid of Brentwood Tree Board- Deerwood tree's were identified and mapped

# 2002-2007

Aeration added to ponds

## 2014

- All dirt trails are paved
- Original cedar fencing replaced with 4-board horse fence

#### 2019

 Restrooms remain open all day for park use

## 2016-2022

 Classroom used for scout & troop meetings
